You have applied in accordance with Section 9 of the Environmental Protection Act for approval of:

- one (1) Komori Print Press equipped with two (2) natural gas fired dryers having a combined maximum thermal input rating of 1.74 million kilojoules per hour, discharging to the atmosphere through:

- one (1) stack designated **Source No. 4**, having a volumetric flow rate of 0.61 cubic metres per second and exit cross sectional dimensions of 0.20 metre by 0.20 metre, extending 1.88 metres above the roof and 9.35 metres above grade; and

- one (1) stack designated **Source No. 5**, having a volumetric flow rate of 4.17 cubic metres per second and exit cross sectional dimensions 0.25 metre by 0.36 metre, extending 1.30 metres above the roof and 8.77 metres above grade;

- maintenance welding operations designated **Source No. 26**;

- one (1) natural gas fired make-up air unit having a maximum thermal input rating of 264,000 kilojoules per hour;

- one (1) natural gas fired heating, ventilation, and air conditioning unit having a maximum thermal input rating of 1.00 million kilojoules per hour;

all in accordance with the Application for Approval (Air & Noise) submitted by Jones Packaging Inc., dated March 13, 2009 and signed by Kevin Nash, Manager, Health, Safety & Environment; and the supporting information, including the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report dated March 16, 2009 and the email dated June 10, 2009, both submitted by Pinchin Environmental Ltd. and signed by Trang Nguyen, and the Acoustic Assessment Report submitted by Pinchin Environmental Ltd., dated March 11, 2009 and signed by Aidan Maher.

For the purpose of this Certificate of Approval and the terms and conditions specified below, the following definitions apply:

1. "Certificate" means this Certificate of Approval, issued in accordance with Section 9 of the EPA.
2. "Company" means Jones Packaging Inc.

3. "Director" means any Ministry employee appointed by the Minister pursuant to Section 5 of the EPA.
4. "EPA" means the Environmental Protection Act.
5. "Equipment" means the equipment and processes described in the Company's application, this Certificate and in the supporting documentation referred to herein, to the extent approved by this Certificate.
6. "Facility" means the entire operation on the property where the Equipment is located.
7. "Manual" means a document or a set of documents that provides written instructions to staff of the Company.
8. "Ministry" means the Ontario Ministry of the Environment.
9. "Publication NPC-205" means Ministry Publication NPC-205 "Sound Level Limits for Stationary Sources in Class 1 & 2 Areas (Urban)", October 1995.
10. "Publication NPC-232" means Ministry Publication NPC-232 "Sound Level Limits for Stationary Sources in Class 3 Areas (Rural)", October 1995.

You are hereby notified that this approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

Noise Emissions

1. The Company shall ensure that the noise emissions from the Facility comply with the limits determined in accordance with Publications NPC-205 or NPC-232, as applicable.

Operation and Maintenance Manual

2. The Company shall ensure that the Facility is properly operated and maintained at all times. The Company shall:

(1) prepare, not later than three (3) months after the date of this Certificate, and update, as necessary, a Manual outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the Equipment, including:

- (a) routine operating and maintenance procedures in accordance with good engineering practices, and as recommended by the Equipment suppliers;
- (b) emergency procedures;
- (c) procedures for any record keeping activities relating to operation and maintenance of the Equipment;
- (d) all appropriate measures to minimize noise and odourous emissions from all potential sources;
- (e) the frequency of inspection of the Equipment; and
- (f) procedures for recording and responding to environmental complaints relating to the operation of the Facility; and

- (2) implement the recommendations of the Manual.

RECORD RETENTION

3. The Company shall retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records and information related to or resulting from the recording activities required by this Certificate, and make these records available for review

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by staff of the Ministry upon request. The Company shall retain:

- (1) all records on the maintenance, repair and inspection of the Equipment;
- (2) all records of any upset conditions associated with the operation of the Equipment;
- (3) all records on the environmental complaints, including:
 - (a) a description, time, date and location of each incident;
 - (b) operating conditions (e.g. upset conditions, etc.) at the time of the incident;
 - (c) wind direction and other weather conditions at the time of the incident;
 - (d) the name(s) of Company personnel responsible for handling the incident;
 - (e) the cause of the incident;
 - (f) the Company response to the incident; and
 - (g) a description of the measures taken to address the cause of the incident and to prevent a similar occurrence in the future, and the outcome of the measures taken.

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

1. Condition No. 1 is included to provide the minimum performance requirements considered necessary to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the Facility.
2. Condition No. 2 is included to emphasize that the Facility must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the EPA, the regulations and this Certificate.
3. Condition No. 3 is included to require the Company to keep records and to provide information to the Ministry so that compliance with the EPA, the regulations and this Certificate can be verified.

In accordance with Section 139 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter E-19, as amended, you may by written Notice served upon me, the Environmental Review Tribunal and in accordance with Section 47 of the Environmental Bill of Rights, S.O. 1993, Chapter 28, the Environmental Commissioner, within 15 days after receipt of this Notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. The Environmental Commissioner will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the Environmental Protection Act, provides that the Notice requiring the hearing shall state:

1. The portions of the approval or each term or condition in the approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
2. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

The Notice should also include:

3. The name of the appellant;
4. The address of the appellant;
5. The Certificate of Approval number;
6. The date of the Certificate of Approval;
7. The name of the Director;
8. The municipality within which the works are located;

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
